Satrap Updates

- By-Law changes: Ordinance 4. Section 1

Sec. 1. Province Assemblies shall be held twice annually between the meetings of the Grand Council. The time and place of these meetings shall be determined by the Province Executive Committee after consultation with the Chapters, or at the request of the Province Executive Committee, or at the request of at least two-thirds (2/3) of the Chapters of the Province. **The order of host Chapters can be adjusted upon consultation with the Province Executive Committee.** The **established** order of host chapters shall be: Delta Zeta, Gamma Kappa, Beta Chi, Delta Psi, Beta Nu, Beta Sigma, Beta Psi, Epsilon, Gamma Epsilon, Zeta Theta.

Satrap Updates

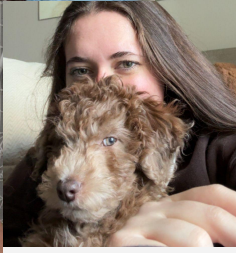
Sec. 1. Province Assemblies shall be held twice annually between the meetings of the Grand Council. The order of host chapters shall be: Delta Zeta, Gamma Kappa, Beta Chi, Epsilon, Beta Nu, Delta Psi, Beta Sigma, Beta Psi, Gamma Epsilon, Zeta Theta. In the event that a chapter or chapter(s) cannot host in the aforementioned order, then the Executive Committee shall work with the chapter(s) on an agreed upon temporary change to the hosting order that is recorded by the Secretary.

Taxes

It's tax season for *most* Chapters and Provinces!

Due Date: May 15th, 2026

- Chapters should use **File990**, as opposed to the IRS website.
- Step-by-step guide is available in the Portal under “**Operations**”
→ “**Taxes**”
- **You must have access to your Chapter Email**
- Chapters in auto-revocation status will work with File990's tax experts and the Grand Counselor to outline a plan for reinstatement to avoid dormancy.

Ordinances & Legislation

- **Chapters should execute a legislative process annually to review local ordinances. *Reference the Universal Collegiate By-Laws***
 1. Solicit Chapter Member proposals to be reviewed by the Chapter's Legislative Committee
 2. Review the Chapter's legislative proposals and vote as a chapter
 - A. If there are no proposals, vote to confirm no changes by the Chapter's membership
 3. Submit local ordinances annually to the Grand Counselor in a Word document.
 - A. Submit with "no changes"
 - B. Submit tracked changes
- **Amendments to the Constitution & By-Laws (CBL)**
 - All Members can submit a proposal for a change to the CBL for consideration at the 62nd GCC
 - Updated process for the Legislative Hearing will be made.
 - Review the 62nd GCC Guide via email and social media

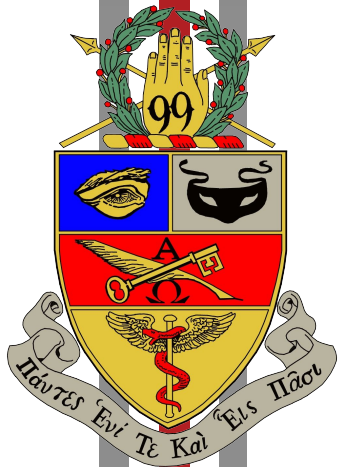

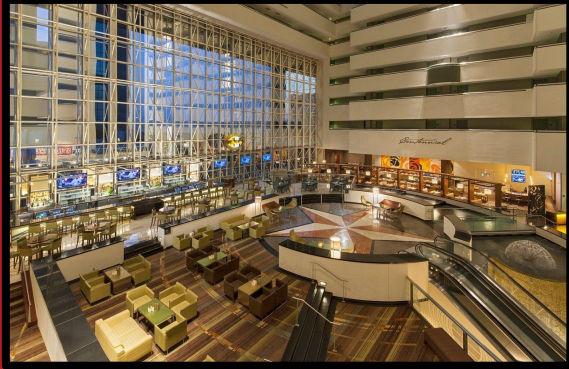
